Daytona Beach West	\$2,100	Rotary Kids and Youth - Healthy Choices - Academic support, recreational and cultural enrichment activities for inner city elementary school third graders.
DeLand	\$1,500	Sweet Dreams - Cribs to needy families to reduce the infant mortality rate.
Fleming Island	\$5,000	Clay County Charitable Dental Clinic - Clay County dentists volunteer their time for those who can't afford dental care. Includes education on dental care. Grant will be used to purchase dental equipment and supplies.
Mandarin	\$5,000	Centennial Park - A walk through recreational area for the library patrons and citizens of the community. This grant will provide a shelter for reading and activity center, park benches and waste receptacles (with concrete slabs for foundation)
Ocala	\$500	Be a Santa to a Senior - 500 seniors at senior care facilities that cater to low income residents will be given gifts. This includes gift distribution events with choirs and holiday snacks.
Orange Park	\$5,000	PET Project - Give disabled the "gift of mobility" by providing a wheelchair that is specialized for the environment of 3rd world countries
Ormond Beach	\$2,000	Cleft Palate Surgery - Provide supplies to support 3+ surgeons and 3 nurses who travel to Dominican Republic to conduct reconstructive surgery on local children with birth defects. One of the dentists is a club member and an additional member will go as an interpreter.
Ormond by the Sea	\$980	Lunch for Nursing Home Shut-ins For 24 years the club has been feeding lunch at an area restaurant to nursing home shut-ins 2-3 times a year.
Palatka Noon	\$1,800	Haiti Medical Clinic Project - Medical examinations and treatment with various medications will be provided.
Palatka Sunrise	\$5,000	Price Martin Community Center - Cosmetic renovation will be made to a municipal building, together with some upgrading and repair of infrastructure, including the kitchen
St Johns	\$2,000	Swaziland Care Center - Infant mortality and health issues are an overwhelming problem in Swaziland, Africa. This grant will be used to establish a Care Point. Up to 250 non-Rotarians, primarily children, will be served by this facility.
