April is Magazine Month in Rotary, a time when we recognize and celebrate our many magazines. About half of us in the Rotary world receive the English language Rotarian each month and the other half receive one of about 30 other publications in one of 24 languages. Some are widely distributed, such as Le Rotarien, the French version, and some, such as Rotariania, published in Polish, have a very narrow distribution.

Whatever language you prefer, when it arrives at your doorstep, I encourage you to check it out. If you haven't taken much time to read it, I think you'll be pleasantly surprised at just how interesting it is.

I myself just finished looking at the recently released April issue. Here are some examples of the articles you'll find this month:

- The story of a Rotarian survivor of the Titanic (April 15th is the 100th anniversary of the sinking).
- An interview with Muhammed Yunus, a winner of the Nobel Peace Prize as the creator of the concept of micro-credit, a

something that that has helped lift millions out of poverty, on the work he is now doing to help create "social" businesses.

- A story about Kenyan Rotarians responding to the problems of drought in their own country.
- An article by a well known Wall Street Journal reporter on some tax avoidance strategies to consider (certainly timely).
- A story about entrepreneurs developing some amazing "low tech" solutions to a range of persistent health and social problems.

But the most interesting, and surprising, story was about prominent musicians who are victims of polio. There's a good chance you already know that violinist Yitzhak Perlman is a polio survivor. After all, he's been prominently featured in Rotary's "End Polio Now" campaign. What surprised me were the following well known musicians who I didn't realize have all also suffered from polio: Judy Collins, Joni Mitchell, Neil Young, David Sanborn, Ian Dury, and Donovan.

For those of you who have traded out of paper and into digital only, there is good news! You now can receive the Rotarian magazine digitally. A company called Zinio offers a downloadable app. You can request your subscription be changed from paper to digital only at no additional charge. For more information, check the rotary.org web site.

And for those of you who don't even enjoy reading on an iPad, iPhone, Android, or Blackberry, there actually is a solution. It's called the Rotary Video Magazine. The editors at the Rotarian magazine produce videos of important stories in the print edition. What makes

these videos so good is that they can make excellent club programs. It's good to have the Rotary Video Magazine available in case your club's speaker doesn't show up. All you need is a computer, LCD projector and screen and you'll have a great program to show!

Speaking of great news stories, it's almost time for our District Conference Cruise to Cozumel (April 19 – 23) on Royal Caribbean's Jewel of the Seas. It's going to be a great adventure! The Rotary Foundation - We're not about buying ice cream

About 10 years ago I was speaking about our Rotary Foundation at a District Assembly held at the Harborview in downtown Clearwater. I told about our Ambassadorial Scholarship program being the largest privately sponsored International scholarship program in the world.

I praised the virtues of our Matching Grants program which every day of the year alleviates hunger, helps supply people with prosthetic limbs, provides medicine and medical supplies to hospitals that are short on these two items, and provides desks and books to children that are anxious to learn, but whose schools don't have the basic essentials necessary to teach them.

I told about wonderful young professionals I had hosted while they were visiting our district as part of a GSE team. I told how we had stayed in touch, and how this program was building better relationships between countries.

I told a wonderful story about a child with polio that I heard from past R.I. President Herbert Brown. I mentioned that our Foundation's Polio Plus program was responsible for saving millions of children from getting this dreaded disease, the largestcrippler of children in the history of mankind.

I also touched on 3-H Grants, and other humanitarian programs and grants.

At the end I pleaded with every one attending to ask their club members if they couldn't put 27 cents a day aside for our Rotary Foundation and become a sustaining member, (27 Cents a day equals about \$100.00 a year and a donation of \$100.00 a year makes an individual a sustaining member).

During a break that followed my talk, a gentleman I had never seen before came up to me and said he had gotten there late and just heard the end of my speech. He said, in a sarcastic manner, "I heard you ask for 27 cents a day---- what are we going to do, buy kids an ice cream cone every week?. I said-- "no sir, the Rotary Foundation is not about buying children ice cream cones. It's about much more important matters than ice cream. Let me tell you what 27 cents a day to the Rotary Foundation might do:

It might buy 900 doses of the polio vaccine; it might provide eyesight to 3 people in India; it might provide four new wells to a rural village in Kenya, or it might provide prosthetic limbs to two people in Thailand or Haiti so they can walk again and provide for their family.

Can you, sir, spare 27 cents a day?"

The man didn't introduce himself, didn't say thank you, didn't say "I don't believe in helping others", he just walked away. At lunch time he came up to me and handed me an envelope. Inside the envelope were ten \$20.00 bills and a note that he was sorry he hadn't got there in time to hear my entire speech.

This man, who I didn't like at first impression, turned out to be a true Rotarian. He cared about people less fortunate than himself and was ready to help. Can you help our Rotary Foundation?

Cheryl responded by saying that her journey started in 1997 when she and her family submitted application to the U.S. Consulate in Trinidad and Tobago to emigrate to the United States. Six years later, in December of 2003, after an extensive process, they received letters from the Immigration and Naturalization Service welcoming them as permanent residents of the U.S. She and her children travelled from Trinidad in September 2004, and settled in Spring Hill with her parents who were already citizens.

One must wait for five years after becoming a permanent resident in order to apply for citizenship. Seven years and \$678 later, she made application to become a citizen in November 2011. It was with a great sense of pride that she stood at the Tampa Convention Center to be sworn in as a US Citizen on March 14, 2012. She said "I almost outshone the sun that day, so excited was I to finally belong and be accepted in my country of adoption. I proudly stood beside the 450 other immigrants to sing God Bless America and the Star Spangled Banner. I was now officially an American."

Don's and Cheryl's words made this one of the finest and proudest few minutes the Rotary Club of Brooksville has ever experienced!!! Cheryl has been an outstanding Rotarian and she is really loved by us all.
